Behind those closed doors, it has been very busy with the renovations, but also with massive re-organization and cleaning projects. Every conceivable surface or item that could be cleaned was thoroughly scrubbed, from windows to tables and chairs, refrigerators (inside and out), gym equipment, popcorn machine, floors, walls, and so on. There was even a bit of painting done.

All storage areas were cleaned out and rearranged, resulting in several trips to waste and recycling depots. ## **Renovations Are Done**

With the completion of the renovations, the centre now has an all-NEW canteen from top to bottom, including the light bulbs! It has a new layout, new appliances, new cabinetry, new flooring, new light fixtures, and a new service counter, all compliant with the City of Winnipeg's universal design code. Brandi Burton is busy planning the reopening, which will hopefully be sooner rather than later. The plans include hiring students to help staff the canteen during the summer and into the Fall, so keep an eye out on our web site and outdoor sign for employment opportunities.

The new high efficiency furnace and air conditioner not only bring air conditioning to the canteen for the first time, but also facilitated the removal of a second aging furnace, which means a new storage room. Lack of sufficient storage has been an ongoing problem, so more storage space is very welcome.

The renovations were made possible by a \$100,000 grant from the City of Winnipeg's Community Centre Renovation Grant Program. The centre provided an additional \$20,000 out of cumulative operating surpluses for the appliances and engineering consultations.

# Message From The General Manager

From wonderful weather conditions to code red - this winter has been anything but ordinary. Luckily, thanks to all of our hardworking staff and volunteers the Linden Woods Community Centre has been fortunate to offer quality rink services to the community.

Special thanks goes to our **House and Grounds Director Reza MirRashed** for his dedicated work ensuring we can provide a quality service to the community. Thanks also to our reliable ice maker **Mitchell Samborski**, who was tasked with getting the ice viable at the end of the year and keep it maintained throughout the season. That was not so tough during the mild January, but he has also been enduring the crisp & cruel February days. I'd also like to the thank rink users for



their patience this year and ask for their continued support in ensuring that the rinks are available for all skaters, of all skills and activity types, and for following our posted public health orders. (Posted on website and rink boards)

As a recreational hockey player myself, having all our league games cancelled, it has been a difficult season thus far, but having a place to skate and exercise has made it a little more bearable. Hopefully as we continue to maintain our rink surfaces, we can get some good weather and are able to make the most of this season. At our outdoor rinks (#ODR) we strive to provide the best ice we can, which usually means flooding and scraping early in the morning so that rinks are ready for the afternoon skaters. Although the building itself remains closed, the rinks are open to all skaters. There are social-distanced hay bales for putting on and removing skates. Thanks to the newly installed timer, the lights go on at dusk and off at 9:30pm Monday through Thursday and at 10:30pm Friday to Sunday.

And that's not all we have going on! The Winnipeg Trails Association is creating a new one-kilometer cross country ski loop around Kleysen park with the trailhead popping up at the south-east corner of the parking lot. This trail is one of several new loops being tracked across Winnipeg through a partnership between the City of and the Winnipeg Trails Association.
