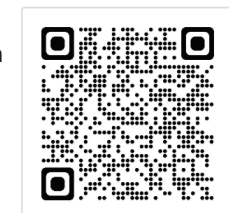

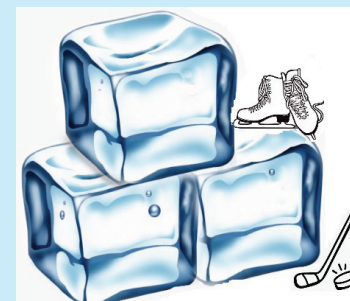


Sunday, November 5th, 10am—4pm

FALL QUILT MAKING



EVENING CLASSES have been added. Yay! However, the only evening available is Friday. Provided classes will be suitable for both absolute beginners and experienced quilters. A couple of popular techniques will round out the year's offerings.

INTRODUCTION TO QUILT MAKING - If you are completely new to quilting or would like a good refresher this class will be a great hands-on opportunity to practice all the essential skills. We will cover rotary cutting, accurate piercing, colour theory, block assembly, design principles, sashing and borders, preparation of the quilt layers, basic hand and machine quilting techniques, and finally the binding. That's a lot but it will be presented in a way that will give you a clear understanding of how a quilt is built. Sewing machine is not required, it is optional.

*Friday, Nov 10, 17, & 24. Days 1-4pm - 3 classes: \$90.
CUTTING, PIECING & DESIGNING CURVES & CIRCLES - This is a favourite. Curves are fabulous! They elevate the humble quilt to something exciting and dynamic. Curves are not difficult to sew and there are so many variations of how to place them in a quilt. You will be designing your own small quilt and you can either quilt by hand or bring your sewing machine. This class is open to everyone including beginners.
*Friday Dec 1, 8, & 15. Days 1-4 pm. Or Evenings 6:30-9:30. 3 classes: \$90.

KLEYSSEN PARK construction underway

It is anticipated that construction on the playground enhancement will begin during this newsletter creation process ... but that doesn't mean the time for donating towards this project has run out! The generous matching offer by **Hubert and Bernice Kleysen** will soon expire, though!



On **OCTOBER 31st, 2023**, the fund-matching offer ends. There are only a few days left to help reach the \$25,000 maximum. To date, \$18,150 has been received and forwarded to the City of Winnipeg to cover the cost of the play structure expansion. New donations directed to "KLEYSSEN PARK" and any matching funds will go towards the construction of the picnic shelter in the spring, plus additional improvements to the park. There are a few 'wish list' items that could come to fruition, with added donations.

BOARD MEMBER NEEDED

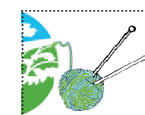
LWCC Board needs a House & Grounds Director: Oversees purchases for, and maintenance of, all things inside/outside.

***THE NEWEST* Knit and Pearl** - Starts Wednesday, November 15th–December 13th. There will be no specific instructor, no specific students . . . but a group of same yarn-minded folks, coming together to learn from each other, and challenge each other to knit and chat about family, worldly and neighbourly things.

***NEW this Fall* Intro to Sports** is a youth program that offers multiple learning opportunities for several sports.

The goal is to provide youth with the opportunity to try a variety of sports and learn the fundamentals of these sports without having to commit to a long-term team. It will allow youth to gain experience in sports and provide them with the basic playing skills. Both Intro soccer, and basketball (ages 5-8) and intro volleyball and intermediate basketball ages (8-12) are 12 week classes, however, there are a few open spots in fall sessions for both volleyball and soccer.
