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

Yard Sale is a GO....for June 3rd!!!



Kleysen Park enhancement *Match Funds Opportunity*

The proposed plans on display at the Annual General Meeting have been tweaked a bit and tendered for quotes, spring is here, and hopefully the construction will begin soon. As with most outdoor construction projects in Winnipeg, all outdoor schedules are very much weather dependent. A version of the photo display of the proposed enhancements to Kleysen Park that was available at the Annual General Meeting is now posted on our web site. Please take a look, but keep in mind that the final project will most likely be a little different, depending on costs and things that come up during construction.

The planned enhancements include: (Find this newsletter online-www.lindenwoodscc.com/newsletters.html -to enlarge picture)

- A play structure expansion, to include a greater variety of play components that will at the same time improve accessibility.
- Six new trees
- A picnic shelter with two picnic tables, one of which will be accessible.
- Bicycle racks
- New accessible entries to the playground
- Granular path connections between the playground, picnic shelter, and spray pad
- Remedial work on the drainage in the area surrounding the spray pad

This project was initiated by a \$25,000 donation to the Linden Woods Community Foundation by **Hubert and Bernice Kleysen, who have committed to donating up to

an additional \$25,000 to match funds raised in the community. If you would like to help make this project even bigger and better, you can take advantage of this matching offer by making a donation to the Linden Woods Community Foundation, designated to "Kleysen Park". nual meeting since 2019. During the intervening four years, the Foundation maintained the annual scholarships at the Universities of Manitoba and Winnipeg, funded a few small projects at the Centre, and helped launch the Kleysen Park improvement project.

During 2022, revenues totalled \$28,972.21, which included \$25,956.49 in donations, \$2,283.00 in grants, and \$731.72 of investment income. On the expenditure side, \$2,290 was paid out for scholarships, \$4,034.05 funded projects and activities at the centre, and \$44.20 was for administration - total expenditures of \$6,368.24.

The Foundation ended the year with funds on hand of \$61,730.13. Of that, \$24,878.49 has been set aside in the Klevsen Park

They are not difficult to sew and there are so many variations of how to place them in a guilt. You will be designing your own small quilt and you can either quilt by hand or bring your sewing machine to this class.

Tuesday May 30 and June 6 & 20. 1-4 pm. 3 classes: \$90. Jingle Bells - Fabric Painting with Acrylics

This is a different kind of painting and it can be very elegant because of the background fabric and the gorgeous paints. This fun guilt features a reindeer standing on a chimney, so not so elegant, just very cute. Great little seasonal guilt.

Thursday June 1 & 8. 1-4 pm. 2 classes: \$60. Introduction to Quilt Embellishment & Fabric Manipulation This is a brand new class for me and I am very excited about it. It is a way of adding unexpected finishing touches to a guilt. It can be the WOW factor. Embellishments make your guilt unique and are a lot of fun to do.

Tuesday June 13 & 27. 1 - 4 pm 2 classes \$60. Introduction to Hand Appliqué

This is a great skill to have and it's convenient to have at least one portable project on the go. It is surprising how much you can get done when you take advantage of little moments of time. Learn a variety of ways to get the best results and to find out which is your favorite method.

Long Time Volunteer, Julie Bubnick...

...is taking a break from the LWCC board, but in her tenure in the community thus far, she has racked up an impressive bio of positions/responsibilities. Julie began her long volunteer resume in 1993. She held positions of President, Vice President and Treasurer in the Linden Woods Community Association up until 2010. The Community Association was wound up shortly thereafter.

Her service within the LW Community Foundation was similar (aside from brief absences) where she held similar positions from 1993-present. She has worked diligently to bring the financial records into a consumable product for both the board and the City of Winnipeg, to whom we are accountable.

During her involvement with Victoria-Linden Woods Community Centre, from 2002-2006. Julie held the position of Treasurer. She then oversaw the separation of Victoria & Linden Woods, and the division of the assets (mostly cash).

Foresight and planning had Julie maintaining the inactive corporation of LWCC from 2003-2006. The separation of the two community centres, set the stage for activating the corpora-

Julie acquired and retained her role as the Treasurer of the LWCC Board from 2007-2011 and after a brief absence, returned to that same role for six months in the 2016-17 term. Following this, Julie answered the next call, which was to fill the position of Vice-President between 2017-2019, but she returned to Treasurer until just recently, when she handed over the reigns to Edith Weber.

And just when you were wondering if she only dealt with the money—we can confirm that this is not the case! The way Julie tells it, she pretty well did everything, except make ice and coach sports! She was involved in all of the capital campaigns; on the building committee for the original centre (1996), spray pad (2007), and the gym (2010). She also spearheaded the update to the canteen (2021) and embarked upon a landscape design for the centre's front area.

Most challenging and most rewarding: putting together the funding package for the gym (applied for LOTS of grants, and got all of them)

What's next? The fun stuff: craft sale, canteen, maybe start up a coffee klatch. Julie is not finished with volunteering or community involvement. Julie has a wealth of information and experience that is invaluable to the community centre, in the months/years ahead.
